

Spirit Awards are presented to those volunteers and organizations in the community who have put forth an exceptional effort on behalf of the United Way during the annual campaign, mostly in workplaces. Over the years, workers from CUPE 50 have donated almost one million dollars to the United Way. The amount they show on their books is \$953,825.00, although records date only from 1995. In 2010 the Local raised \$91,301 through payroll deductions and another \$2,409 at special events, for a total of \$93,710.
